MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

The Year of Transformation

The 2019-20 fiscal year was a year of transformation. Nova Vita embarked on a strategic planning journey with the gentle guidance and sage insight of Joan Riggs - Catalyst Research & Communications. Our Board of Directors, management team, staff, and community partners all took part in reflecting on our organization's strengths and challenges, and what we envision for Nova Vita. Through this process we developed a new logo coupled with a new website design and layout, inspiring hope and growth, which we debuted at our 2019 Annual General Meeting. We reimagined our vision of the world we are striving towards and aligned our mission to the work we are doing, underscoring the complexity of preventing, intervening, and responding to interpersonal violence and abuse. We solidified and articulated our value statements to lay the foundation of our organization and to clearly represent the way in which we do our work.

Our year was dedicated and focused on redefining Nova Vita, building on our strengths, critically reflecting on our challenges, and creating a path forward to anticipate and respond to the needs of the individuals, families, and communities we serve. By the end of February 2020, the Board of Directors had finalized our new vision, mission, values, and strategic plan.

Two weeks later, the world was engulfed by the COVID-19 global pandemic and life as everyone knew it came to a grinding halt.

On March 13, 2020 Nova Vita assembled our Emergency Response Team and immediately dove into action to respond to the crisis that was quickly consuming the world. Volunteers and visitors were sent home, outreach staff were quickly redeployed to the shelter and to the crisis support line, sanitization protocols were enhanced, screening checks were implemented, and the community was reassured that our emergency shelter would remain open and safe. Instinctively our team of staff tended to our most vulnerable clients, the women and children who called Nova Vita their home and had nowhere else to go. Gentle reminders to wash hands, coaching to socially distance, and smiling through our eyes all became commonplace and the new way in which we provided support.

Even within a COVID context, Nova Vita is committed to being a safe haven and a pillar of hope in our community. We will continue to anticipate and respond to the complexities of domestic violence, intimate partner violence, and gender based violence. We are choosing to embrace our new vision, mission, and values, as we boldly move forward through these unprecedented times. We invite you to learn more about the work we do and to join us in making a difference.











Accountable
