Message From The Executive Director And President Of The Board

This past year, Nova Vita would not have been successful without the dedication, diligence, and determination of our staff team. As with the rest of the world, COVID-19 has brought exhaustion and burnout. At Nova Vita, we recognize that in order to continue to provide safe shelter, crisis support, meaningful interventions, and transformative counselling to clients in need, we must take care of our employees. To that end, we have invested in our mental health benefits for all of our employees, provided COVID-relief days for mental and physical well-being, and offer monthly employee wellness activities in the spirit of building professional resiliency both within the organization and in the community.

At Nova Vita, we remain steadfast in our commitment to anti-racism/anti-oppression work. With funding from Women and Gender Equality Canada, our Multicultural Community Engagement Worker developed and implemented an interactive training program to over 45 employees.

Additionally, we partnered with Brantford Police Service to deliver anti-human trafficking training and education to community partners, co-presented at a one-day conference to over 500 teen girls, provided transitional outreach supports to those at risk of being trafficked, and offered safe emergency shelter for those in immediate need.

We also made great gains to increase access to our services for those seeking our support. We implemented an end-to-end encrypted text and web-based chat service, accessible through our existing help line and website; we partnered with Brant OPP on an initiative that will continue into next year to provide a dedicated rural outreach worker, gender-based violence training for emergency personnel, and a media campaign throughout the County of Brant; and after years of planning, we took the bold step to open a safe and discreet counselling office in the new Cowan Community Health Hub to deliver outreach support services in the County of Brant.

We have achieved so much this past year despite the challenges endured by the pandemic but we know there's still much more to do to address domestic violence, intimate partner violence, and gender-based violence. We can't do it without the continued commitment of our team at Nova Vita, the help of our volunteers, and the support of community donors. Together, we can continue to make a difference.





Programs & Services

Serving Brantford and the County of Brant for over 35 years, Nova Vita provides safe shelter, security, and essential support to individuals and families impacted by violence and homelessness.

- 24 Hour Crisis and Support Line is available to anyone in the community who has experienced violence or abuse in their relationship. 519-752-HELP | novavita.org/chat
- Emergency Shelter for women and their children, who are fleeing domestic violence or are homeless.
- Transitional Housing & Support Program assists women and their children living in the community with safety planning, housing, court support, and transitioning to a life free of violence.
- 2nd Stage Housing Program offers 8 transitional housing units with additional wrap-around support for women and their children.
- Community Counselling for Women* provides trauma-informed individual and group counselling for women who have experienced abuse in their relationships.
- Children's Program provides trauma-informed counselling and support to children who have witnessed or experienced abuse in their home. Parenting support, safety planning, and counselling is also offered to parents and caregivers.
- Youth Support Services provides trauma-informed counselling and support for youth between the ages of 13 to 18.
- Family Programs, including our Differential Response Program (in partnership with Child and Family Services of Grand Erie) and Caring Families Program, provide wrap-around intervention and support services for all members of the family.
- Challenge to Change Program provides individual and group counselling for those who have used, or are at risk of using, violence in their relationships.
- Men's* Support Services provides trauma-informed counselling for men who have experienced abuse or who have caused harm in their relationships.
- Community Outreach and Public Education delivers informative presentations to local schools, businesses, and community organizations about healthy relationships, human trafficking, how to support someone experiencing abuse, and programs we offer.









Where We Are Growing

Victim Support Grant

In partnership with the Brant OPP, the Victim Support Grant aims to improve support for individuals and families living in Brant County impacted by domestic violence or human trafficking. Program initiatives include: the creation of public education and awareness materials, traumainformed training for emergency services personnel, and the hiring of additional staff to expand services and outreach supports to rural communities.




